We want to preserve, maintain and enhance Cilento's cultural and human heritage so that our children and visitors can enjoy and appreciate it for years to come. Where we are

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Course programme

Our courses are designed for students who already have a basic level of Italian and wish to build upon this foundation. Please test your level here.

LILIC's courses combine two approaches:

Traditional

Two hours in the morning (50 minutes each) in the classroom, following a modern communicative approach. Students are assigned classes according to their knowledge of Italian.

Scattered classroom and Project work

In the afternoon, students will immerse themselves in local culture in a series of workshops. Students interact with representatives of the Cilento communities; local people make a point to reinforce the Italian knowledge of the students. Workshops consist of videos that are prepared by students who interview representatives of the local community and record Cilento's life-style.

Syllabus Scattered classroom and Project Work

Morning Students are assigned to groups based on the results of their language tests. Each group contains no more than 12 students and is taught by a fully qualified teacher who is a Italian native speaker. NB: Absolute beginners (AO) and master level (C1) can ask the school's director for individual lessons.

Afternoon Students make short films aimed at reinforcing their linguistic skills. These videos are focused on daily life in Pisciotta. The most popular topics include:

OUR SEA

This project aims to document cultural practices in Cilento and students will find out how local fishermen make the most of the products they catch. OUR LAND

Again, students examine cultural practices in the region and learn about Pisciotta's unique olive trees and local agriculture from local growers.

OUR LIVES

Students will learn why Cilento is home to the longest-living in Europe and why and how they are happy (see film: Benvenuti al Sud). LILIC Learn Italian and Live In Cilento

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Project Work

Morning courses follow traditional syllabuses in line with the communicative approach and the guidelines of the Council of Europe. Language needs are therefore identified, together with the knowledge and know-how required for attaining a higher linguistic level.

In the afternoon students interview local people and prepare videos to be shown on Friday. Students are divided into two groups:

Group a) dealing with the people, the timeline and the legal-administrative foundation required to prepare videos and, after they are realized, how they can best be diffused.

Group b) Production of interviews; Logistics and video making.

The weekly curriculum works as follows:

Monday – Project work preparation for the interviews Tuesday – Interviews take place;

Wednesday - Interviews (continued) and cookery class Thursday - Assessment of the material for video editing Friday - Screening of the videos. Discussion on how to market the video that has been produced.

At the end of the week, a certificate of attendance is delivered, certifying the activities that have been performed and students' linguistic competence.

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Accommodation

Accommodation - Students live in single rooms in apartments overlooking the sea and olive groves.

Accommodation - Availability and Prices.

Pisciotta is a UNESCO World heritage site and there are only limited rooms available during the summer months. The best rooms are in high demand. We advise you to book in advance of the course (end April – early May) if you wish to secure comfortable accommodation close to the sea.

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How to reach Pisciotta

By plane + train: Arriving at Rome (Ciampino - Fiumicino) or Naples (Capodichino), make your way to the main railway station -Termini (Rome) or Centrale (Napoli). Any local train going to Sapri will stop in Pisciotta-Palinuro. Faster trains include Intercity and Frecciarossa (check <u>Trenitalia</u> website).

Note: from 9th June 2019 the summer train schedule entails more frequent connections. The train takes approximately 4 hours from Rome and 2 hours from Naples.

By car: From A3 Salerno - Reggio Calabria highway exit Buonabitacolo and continue on SS 517. At Policastro Bussentino turn right and to SS 18; exit Poderia; proceed to Palinuro on SR 562 running along the Mingardo river. At the Palinuro roundabout, exit right direction Pisciotta. Alternatively, from North: A3 Salerno - Reggio Calabria highway, exit Battipaglia and continue on the SS 18 towards Agropoli / Vallo della Lucania. Exit Poderia; proceed to Palinuro on SR 562 running along the Mingardo river. At the Palinuro roundabout, exit right, direction Pisciotta.
